

WHAT'S NEW...

❖ 2010 ELECTIONS:



Spring Election will be held on April 6th.

If you are not registered to vote, you may register at the Village Hall during regular business hours, Monday through Friday from 8:30 a.m. until 4:30 p.m. until the day of the election, or at the polling place on the day of the election. Your drivers' license number must be included on the registration application. If you do not have a drivers' license, you may enter the last four digits of your Social Security number or your Wisconsin State ID card number. **REGISTRATION CANNOT BE PROCESSED UNTIL THIS INFORMATION IS PROVIDED.**

All elections are held at the Fredonia Government Center, 242 Fredonia Avenue. The polls are open from 7:00 a.m. until 8:00 p.m.

❖ DOG LICENSES:

Information required includes dog's name, color, breed, sex and evidence of rabies vaccination, including the date. Cost is \$10.00; if the dog is neutered or spayed the cost is \$5.00. A dog license is needed each year. If a dog is not licensed by April 1st, a \$5.00 late fee is added.



PARKING AND SNOW REGULATIONS:

No parking on village streets from 2:00 a.m. until 6:00 a.m. from December 1st to April 1st. Any vehicle ticketed for winter parking restrictions and not removed will be towed away at the owner's expense.



Snow is to be removed from sidewalks within 24 hours after a snowfall. Snow is not to be shoveled or blown into the street.

Please shovel the area around the fire hydrant. When shoveling out mailboxes, be sure to shovel a car-length pathway in front of your mailbox to guarantee mail delivery.

❖ **2010 CENSUS**

The U.S. Census counts all U.S. residents – citizens and non-citizens alike, and is required by the Constitution to take place every 10 years. Starting the week of February 22nd the Census Bureau will be delivering a short 10-question form to every household in America. You are required to fill in the form to account for everyone living at your address as of April 1, 2010. It includes a prepaid envelope with the form so you can mail it back as soon as possible. Through late August Census Bureau temporary field staff will work in neighborhoods across the United States to follow-up in person with every address that doesn't mail the form back in order to collect the information needed and verify addresses. All Census Bureau employees can be identified through identification cards issued by the Census Bureau.

❖ **WHAT IS THE CENSUS?**

The 2010 Census will help communities receive more than \$400 billion in federal funds each year for things like:

- Hospitals
- Job training centers
- Schools
- Senior centers
- Bridges, tunnels and other public works projects
- Emergency services
- The data collected by the census also helps determine the number of seats your state has in the U.S. House of Representatives
